In-Ear Monitor Spec-sheet

The band generally carries it's own complete in-ear monitor system. While this will make most shows vastly easier for all parties, it may, in some cases, be impractical to use due to festival-style, multi-band bills, or abnormal FoH snaking locations. In which case we will require a standard monitor system as described in our general tech rider and stage plot.

General Notes:

Our stage split and monitor rig reside in a rack on upstage right, between the drum riser and bass position. WE MIX OUR OWN MONITORS from laptops, tablets, iPhones and/or iPods via our own wi-fi router.

What we are carrying:

- > Presonus RM-32 Digital Mixer
- > 32 Channels of transformer-isolated splits (phantom TBD per-show)
- > 25-foot "tails" from our stage split to your FoH snake.

Tails are numbered to correspond with our standard input list.

- > Sub-snakes to run from splitter to far down-stage left & right
- > Mic cable looms for most of our stage (drum kit, keyboards, percussion, pans)
- > All our wired and wireless in-ear systems/monitors/cables/buds
- > Microphones & Instrument DI's

What we need provided locally by you:

- > Microphone stands, drum mic clips, Z-bars for amps (see stage plot for count)
- > Single Microphone cables (approx 20 in assorted lengths)
- > Side-fill monitors (in case the IEM rig heads south) Can be matrixed off a FoH mix
- > 2 to 4 Monitor wedges for contingency situations, dependent upon stage size. Can be matrixed off a FoH mix
- > We would appreciate a selection of mics for the drum kit and elsewhere. While we are carrying almost a complete mic pack, we always welcome a better mic selection than what we may have.
